Office of the Executive Vice President:

- ____ Campus Organizing Interns will help to lead ground and grassroots organizing for the office in order to gain support and meet the needs of the students. Increasing awareness, political activism, and school spirit on campus through planning and holding events, tabling on Ring Road and networking with other students to gain power in numbers on campus are the main roles of the campus organizing interns.
- ____ Publicity In conjunction with Campus Organizing, the publicity commission is responsible for publicizing the EVP office. This includes creating publicity materials and outreaching to get as many students and UCI affiliates to come out to the events as possible. They will also create any art work and necessary items to represent the EVP office, while acting as a liaison between publication (i.e. the New U...) and the EVP office.
- ____ Legislative Liaison Interns will help to oversee all lobbying efforts to state and National governments. Besides managing and developing the Lobby Core Program, the legislative liaison is responsible for meeting legislators, networking with political leaders, and traveling to Sacramento twice a year to lobby and gain speaking, writing and other leadership skills necessary for meeting and keeping in touch with local and state legislators.
- ____ Local Gov't Liaison The Local Government Liaison will be the main lobbyist and liaison to the city of Irvine and Orange County government. They will craft the direction of local government affairs in ASUCI, and advocate for student issues with the President. They are also the main liaison between the office and the Dean of Students, where they will work with the Administrative Affairs VP to strengthen ties and advocate for student issues. The interns will also be attending local city council meetings and in order to gain support and solidify UCI's relationship with Irvine's local government.
- ____ Social In conjunction with campus organizing, interns will work to plan events for the office to help retention efforts within the EVP office. They will also be working to maintain relations throughout the office with activities. Aside from that, social interns will be working collectively with other parts of the EVP office.
