## 2. Projects to vote on:

- Solar Airplane (Resubmission)
  - Outreach is still very small, the budget just changed
  - Most undergrads would not be aware of the project
  - Vote: 0 In Favor, 5 Opposed, 0 Abstain
- AV Garden Greenhouse
  - Roxy: From experienced, is concerned with amount of people who attend the gardens
  - Tyler: Garden is completely student-run, each student is assigned to a department and must come up with project
  - Stipulation: Organization should put TGIF logo on the green house
  - Vote: 4 In Favor, 0 Opposed, 1 Abstain
- HyperXite
  - Application is almost the same as before
  - New team leader
  - Group is still largely unknown to UCI undergraduates
  - Large amount of funds requested for a very exclusive group that will be working on the project
  - Vote: 0 In Favor, 5 Opposed, 0 Abstain
- Hang in There
  - Project stipulation: must add TGIF logos wherever possible
  - Vote: 5 In Favor, 0 Opposed, 0 Abstain
- UCI PHA Summit
  - Most items requested are promotional
  - TGIF cannot fund room bookings
  - Vote: 5 In Favor, 0 Opposed, 0 Abstain
- 3. Projects under review:
- AirEaters
  - Did not attend scheduled meeting at 5:10 p.m.
  - Parts of application still unclear, especially in areas about the purpose for the project
  - Will ask questions about how they are adding onto last year's project

- States that they would provide information gathered to those who request it
- Tabled
- Energy Conservation Program: Smart Plugs
  - Meeting
    - Project to measure energy consumption with Smart Plugs, data sent to a network to monitor changes, can program applications to turn on and off
    - For students to learn about how electricity students use each quarter
    - More of an educational projects to educate students and obtain data
    - Rewards through application use
    - Kiwi application said to obtain 50% more energy efficiency
    - Cost prevents large outreach
    - Will have the ability to determine amount of electricity used per house and per individual
    - App includes facts about energy consumption
  - Jamie: Plugs are temporary, which is the largest turn off
  - Emily: Organization doesn't seem to have a solid plan for what they would do with the data obtained.
  - Tyler: Plugs would only be available for the Sustainability house in Arroyo Vista
